## Methodology

#### **Fieldwork Dates**

23<sup>rd</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> November 2020

#### **Data Collection Method**

• The survey was conducted online. Invitations to complete surveys were sent via email to Labour List readers

#### **Population Sampled**

Labour Party members, who are registered as readers on Labour List

#### Sample Size

• 5,008

### **Data Weighting**


- Data were weighted to the profile of Labour Party members.
- Data were weighted by age, sex, region, and 2020 Labour Party Leadership Election vote.

### **Margin of Error**

- Because only a sample of the full population was interviewed, all results are subject to margin of error, meaning that not all differences are statistically significant.
- For example, in a question where 50% (the worst-case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer,
- with a sample of 5,008 it is 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 1.6% from the sample result.
- Subsamples from the cross-breaks will be subject to higher margin of error, conclusions drawn from crossbreaks with very small sub-samples should be treated with caution.




# Q1–Q10. To what extent do you think favourably or unfavourably towards the following political figures? Summary Topline






# Q11. In your view, is the Labour Party currently moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?






# Q12. Which of the following statements best reflects your view of the policies in Labour's 2019 General Election manifesto?












## Q31. Do you have a positive or negative view of Jeremy Corbyn's response to the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) report?










# Q37–Q41. In your view, to what extent was the Labour Party united or divided under the following leaders? Summary Topline








# Q43–Q48. Thinking about activities you participate in as a party member, which of the following do you do? Summary Topline






# Q49. Thinking about the activities you participate in as a party member, currently would you like to be more or less active in party activities?








# Q50. Thinking about the current direction of the Labour Party, are you optimistic or pessimistic?






Q51. To what extent do you think favourably or unfavourably towards Keir Starmer's approach as Leader of the Opposition in handling the COVID-19 pandemic?






# Q52. Thinking about Keir Starmer's approach to crime and security, which of the following statements best reflects your view?
